1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The school district has implemented a health and safety plan throughout the 2020-2021, 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years using mitigation strategies recommended by the CDC, PA Department of Health, CHOP Policy Lab, and the Chester County Health Department. These strategies were successful in supporting the larger public health initiative to slow the spread of COVID-19 and to protect our district community, especially those at increased risk for severe illness. Further, our district supported and advertised vaccination clinics for staff and students, and implemented COVID-19 testing programs to support identifying potential exposures and to keep students and staff in school.

Our district will continue to review the latest guidance from the CDC, PA Department of Health, Delaware County Health Department, and CHOP Policy Lab in the event new information is provided that the district should consider. For the 2023-2024 school year, the district may implement the recommendations rom the Pennsylvania Department of Education, PA Department of Health, CDC, or the Delaware County Department of Health. The district will rely on relevant board policies and legal and/or statutory requirements regarding communicable disease to guide responses to COVID-19. The chart below provides strategies, policies, and procedures to be used within the district in the event of another outbreak.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The district intends to operate all programs in an in-person format. The district has an approved *Emergency Instructional Time Plan* as permitted by PDE [Section 520.1 – 2023-2024 School Year]. This plan will guide any other strategies to be used in the unlikely event that the district must utilize non-traditional approaches to instruction to meet educational needs of students.
